

Trip with a CGN Boat for the 14th of July

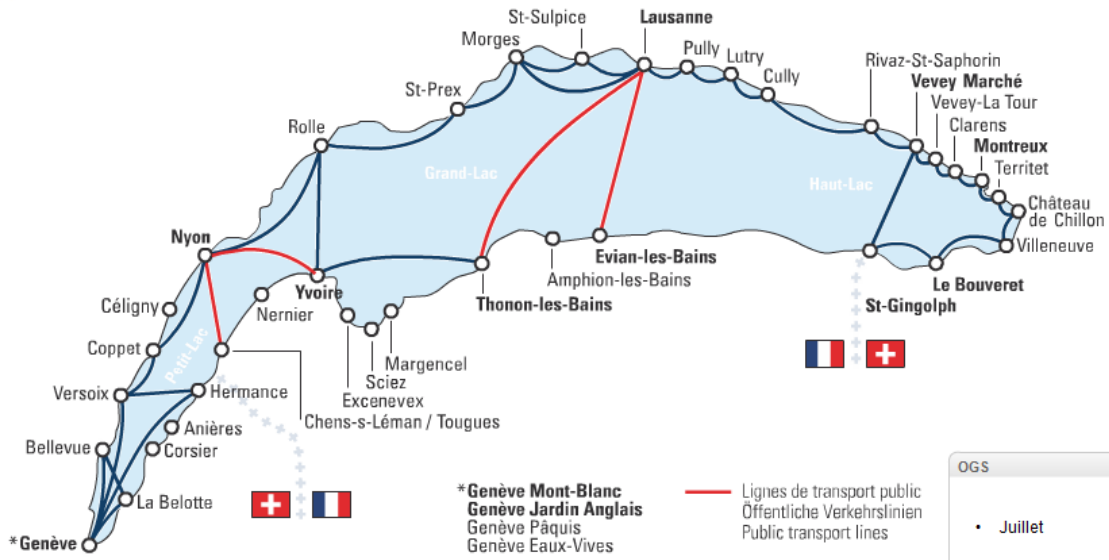

Bastille Day is the French national holiday which is celebrated on 14 July each year. In France, it is formally called La Fête Nationale (National Celebration) and commonly le quatorze juillet (the fourteenth of July). It commemorates the 1790 Fête de la Fédération, held on the first anniversary of the storming of the Bastille on 14 July 1789; the anniversary of the storming of the Bastille fortress-prison was seen as a symbol of the uprising of the modern nation, and of the reconciliation of all the French inside the constitutional monarchy which preceded the First Republic, during the French Revolution.

In order to enjoy this French National day, I suggest you get on a boat that goes in Evian.

The CGN owns the largest fleet of "Belle Epoque" vessels in the world, in terms of passenger capacity. These vessels have plied the largest mass of fresh water in central Europe to the rhythm of their paddle wheels for more than 130 years.
